We asked: What are the priorities in your neighbourhood?

You said: Parking problems at the junction of Market Street and Old Road, Whaley Bridge.

We did: We increased patrols, to speak to and advise drivers about the issue. Derbyshire County Council Parking Enforcement Officers also made spot checks and issued tickets where necessary.

You said: Speeding vehicles from the Bridgemont Island, through to Market Street and Buxton Road, Whaley Bridge.

We did: All officers have been trained to use mobile speed detection devices, patrols increased and speed checks carried out. Youngsters at Whaley Bridge Primary School spent time with officers, checking the speeds of traffic and asking motorists about safe driving.

You said: Nuisance drivers on Reddish Avenue and at the Railway Car Park, Whaley Bridge.

We did: We increased patrols to speak to and advise drivers. The Roads Policing Unit has also made spot checks. Section 59 warnings have been given out if necessary and if drivers are found to be causing a nuisance for a second time after receiving the warning, their vehicle can be seized. We have also been speaking to the Casualty Reduction and Enforcement Support Team to encourage safe and responsible driving.
